CWFL Round Up Saturday 10th April 2021

It's been a busy week in the CWFL with upwards of 30 fixtures being played. Monday 5th April saw the return of cup football to our teams with the Wirral District FA competitions getting underway. In an all CWFL Clash in the **W DFA Amateur Cup First Round** Higher Bebington Kelma and Shafesbury Youth Reserves needed penalties to decide the winner after their game had ended 1-1 after full time, Andy Noonan and Jamie Rutter the respective scorers. Kelma held their nerve to edge the shootout 3-1 and they go on through to the Quarter Finals where they will face Ellesmere Port FC. Liam Casey hit a brace for Unitor in their 4-3 away win over West Cheshire side Poulton Vics FC Reserves. Paul Wallace added a third for Unitor with an own goal sealing the win. Unitor also moved into the Quarter Final stages where a tasty game awaits them in the form of St Saviours who defeated West Cheshire opposition in the form of Capenhurst Villa FC Reserves. The Sav's won their game 2-1 with Jack Sheppard netting both goals. In the **W DFA Junior Cup Round One** Higher Bebington Kelma Vets move into the next round their game with Heswall Youth was decided on penalties after a 0-0 full time score line. Kelma won the shootout 4-2.

Also playing on Monday were the teams from the **CWFL Tarvin Precision Vets Division 2**. Upton JFC went top of the division after a fine 3-2 win over Nags Head Bunbury Vets with goals coming from Ben Walley, Chris Melia and Neil Zarac. Pete Jones and Jonny Stubbs replied for the Nags. Luca Trasatti 2, Rhys Nevett and an own goal earned the points for Ashton FC Vets in their 4-2 win over Hartford FC Vets. Wayne Clarke netted for Frodsham Park JFC Vets in their 1-1 draw with Dee Rangers Vets.

Wednesday 7th April was the return to action for the **CWFL Queensferry Sports Premier Division** teams. League leaders St Saviours could only muster a draw against fifth placed Higher Bebington Kelma. Tom Bloodworth was the Sav's marksman with Shaun Burgess replying for Kelma. The Kelma keeper pulled off a penalty save late on in the game to earn his team the draw. James Atherton scored the only goal of the game for Unitor in their 1-0 win over Groves Athletic. Tom Berry netted twice for Upton JFC in their 2-1 win over Ellesmere Port FC who had Andy Yates to thank for their goal.

Ben Coward hit 6 for Chester Nomads IV's and Alex Cleland hit a seventh as they beat Orange Athletic 7-1, Stu Drury their scorer.

Friday 9th April saw Princes Villa travel to Little Heath to play Christleton FC in **the CWFL Olympic Trophies Championship A**. Jack Harding and a Dan Hamp brace earned Christleton the points in a 3-1 win that saw 3 Princes Villa players sent off.

On Saturday 10th April in the **CWFL Queensferry Sports Premier Division**, second placed Unitor and third place Upton JFC locked horns to see who could close the gap on the resting leaders St Saviours. In a hard fought game that saw Unitor reduced to nine men Upton JFC ran out 6-3 winners with goals coming from Danny Evans 2, Paul Johnson 2, Joe Muir and Tom Berry. James Atherton, Derek Taylor and John Mearns hit the Unitor replies. Ian McGraa fired the winner for Shaftesbury Youth in their 1-0 win over Blacon Youth FC Reserves. Ben Kierman and Jordan Billsborough were the scorers for Higher Bebington Kelma in their 3-0 win over Ellesmere Port FC. 2 of the 3 Kelma goals came in the last 5 minutes of the game with Ellesmere Port pushing for an equaliser.

Chester Nomads III and Shaftesbury Youth Reserves earned a point each from their 8-goal thriller at the Garrison Ground. Trey Lattie 2 and Joe Thompson 2 were the Nomads scorers with Tom Ryan, Joe Roberts, Owen Ross and Ryan Jones replying for the Shafts.

Black Horse keep up their stunning run of form with a 3-0 win over Orange Athletic thanks to strikes from Callum Harrison, Gordon Harrison and Max Tatler in the **CWFL Olympic Trophies Championship B**. Chris Heyes and Johnny Rawcliffe hit a brace a piece for Chester Nomads IV's in their 4-1 win over Neston Nomads Development. Ellis Moore 4, Chris Varney 2, Billy Fennell and James Henry were on target for Waggon & Horses in their 8-1 win over Poulton Vics FC. Poulton more than held their own during the first half with the teams going into the break at 1-1 but Waggon turned up the pressure in the second half to come away comfortable winners. Josh Harper 2 and Paul Humphries were the Runcorn Sports scorers in their 4-2 win over Rossmore Rangers.

In the **CWFL Tarvin Precision Vets Division 2** Upton JFC Vets made it 4 wins from 4 with a 7-2 win over Hartford FC Vets. Jonny Stubbs and Dan Butler 2 scored for Nags Head Bunbury Vets in their 6-3 defeat at the hands of Tarvin Athletic FC Vets. Luca Trasatti and Rhys Nevett were on the mark for Ashton FC Vets in their 2-1 win over Frodsham Park JFC Vets.

In the **CWFL Tarvin Precision Vets Division 3** Nathan Jones, Paul Caputo and Bal Darnoi were the Crossway scorers in their 3-2 win over Ellesmere Port Town FC Vets. FC Vaults beat Winsford Diamonds 1-0 and Queens Park FC Vets beat Great Sutton FC Vets 4-1.
