CWFL Round Up Saturday 17th April 2021

It was the **CWFL Olympic Trophies Championship B** that got the football underway way in the CWFL this week with FC Duddon claiming all the points in their encounter with Chester Nomads IV's on Monday night. Duddon ran out 2-1 winners thanks to a double from Martin Fitzsimons. Also on Monday James Henry 2, Jim Lehman and Josh Jones were the scorers for Waggon and Horses in their 4-0 win over Orange Athletic. In the **CWFL Tarvin Precision Vets Division 1** Higher Bebington Kelma Vets ran out 2-0 winners over Neston Nomads Vets.

On Tuesday Night in the eagerly anticipated **CWFL Tarvin Precision Vets Division 1** game, Avenue Vets scored a 3-0 victory over their closest rivals Ellesmere Port Vets. Thanks to a Paul Johnson brace Upton earned a 2-1 win and move into pole position by 1 point with a game in hand. George Patchett 2 and Liam Smith were the Groves scorers in their 3-1 win over Ellesmere Port, Matt Redmond hit the reply for the Port. Blacon Youth and Higher Bebington Kelma fought out a 1-1 draw in their clash at Cairns Crescent, an own goal and Andy Noonan the respective scorers.
